FROM POINTS NORTH: Take 95 South to Exit 17 (Elmwood Avenue), Take a LEFT at the stoplight onto Elmwood Avenue, Go to FOURTH traffic light and take a LEFT onto Park Avenue, Follow Park Avenue until you can go no further. Take a RIGHT onto Broad Street, Go ½ mile on Broad Street and you will see a gazebo on your right, take the right building is at the corner.

FROM POINTS SOUTH: Take 95 North to Exit 16, Follow exit ramp (stay to the right) to Elmwood Avenue Bear RIGHT onto Elmwood Avenue, Take LEFT at first intersection onto Park Avenue, Follow Park Avenue until you can go no further, Take a RIGHT onto Broad Street, Go ½ mile on Broad Street and you will see a gazebo on the right. Go ½ mile on Broad Street and you will see a gazebo on your right, take the right building is at the corner.

Description: This workshop will assist clinicians to gain valuable skills, knowledge and information related to the “world of work” in relation to integrating this information into their clinical work with clients. Techniques, tools and philosophical rehabilitation perspectives will be provided within the workshop framework. These include helping clients in gaining an understanding of skills, perspectives and attitudes related to successful engagement in meaningful employment. Knowledge gained by clinicians compliments all treatment methodologies utilized by clinicians and can be integrated into most treatment goals developed with clients and, in some cases, vocational goals may actually drive some treatment objectives.

Learning Objectives:

- Help participants gain an understanding of the nature of work in today's society in relation to healthy adult roles and good mental health.
- Help participants to gain an understanding of attitudes, aptitudes and skills/knowledge in relation to the world of work.
- Help participants to put their clients in the “driver seat” in the Choosing, Getting and Keeping” a job while complimenting treatment objectives. (This is critical during when clients are experiencing a serious mental health, substance use issue.)
- Introduce the concept, when appropriate, of Vocational driven treatment goals. Successful examples will be provided.

Richard N. Harris, LICSW, has practiced in the human service field for over 40 years in a variety of settings and has served on numerous commissions, statewide committees and advocacy coalitions. He has been Executive Director of the National Association of Social Workers-Rhode Island Chapter since 2002. Over the years, Rick has worked on numerous advocacy campaigns regarding programs for the poor, civil rights, immigration, health/mental health, aging, vocational rehabilitation, and disability issues. Rick is a Certified Vocational Evaluator; Certified Job Placement Specialist Trainer and a Certified Job Coach Specialist Trainer. He served for many years as an advisor to the Office of Rehabilitation Services; Rick was selected to present in Washington DC several times regarding vocational techniques and at National Vocational Rehabilitation Conferences. He also served as a Grant Team Leader for eight years for the Federal Department of Education & Rehabilitation Services Administration and provided consultations for Supported Employment Regulations, ADA, Federal and State Departments of Labor and the Commission on Accreditation for Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF).
