**Directions** - FROM POINTS NORTH: Take 95 South to Exit 17 (Elmwood Avenue), Take a LEFT at the stoplight onto Elmwood Avenue, Go to FOURTH traffic light and take a LEFT onto Park Avenue, Follow Park Avenue until you can go no further.
