

FROM POINTS NORTH: Take 95 South to Exit 17 (Elmwood Avenue), Take a LEFT at the stoplight onto Elmwood Avenue, Go to FOURTH traffic light and take a LEFT onto Park Avenue, Follow Park Avenue until you can go no further. Take a RIGHT onto Broad Street, Go ½ mile on Broad Street and you will see a gazebo on your right, take the right building is at the corner.

FROM POINTS SOUTH: Take 95 North to Exit 16, Follow exit ramp (stay to the right) to Elmwood Avenue, Bear RIGHT onto Elmwood Avenue, Take LEFT at first intersection onto Park Avenue, Follow Park Avenue until you can go no further, Take a RIGHT onto Broad Street. Go ½ mile on Broad Street and you will see a gazebo on your right, take the right building is at the corner.

Description: This workshop will explore recently adopted national technology standards in social work and explore their implications throughout the profession. Dr. Reamer will provide a comprehensive overview of the relevance of new technology standards to social workers' and clients' growing use of digital technology, electronic and remote interventions, digital and online communications, and social media. He will provide an overview of new regulatory, practice, and ethical standards related to technology. Dr. Reamer will examine complex ethical issues related to social workers' and clients' use of social networking sites, e-therapy, chat rooms, moderated forums, Web-based psychoeducation, self-guided Web-based intervention, video conferencing, telephone therapy, avatar therapy, expert systems, search engines, email exchanges, text messages, and client blogs. The workshop will focus on the implications of new technology standards with regard to issues of privacy, confidentiality, privileged communication, informed consent, boundaries, interstate provision of services, non-traditional interventions, and documentation, among others. Dr. Reamer will make extensive use of case material, explore risk-management implications, and provide opportunity for audience participation.

Key Topics:

- The use of digital technology and social media in social work: Overview and case examples
- New technology standards in social work: Regulatory, practice, and ethical standards
- Ethical and risk-management issues
- Ethical decision-making and risk-management strategies
- Questions/answers

Frederic Reamer, Ph.D., is a professor in the graduate program, School of Social Work, Rhode Island College. He chaired the national task force that wrote the NASW Code of Ethics. Also, he served as chair of the national task force that wrote technology standards recently adopted jointly by the National Association of Social Workers, Association of Social Work Boards, Council on Social Work Education, and Clinical Social Work Association (*NASW, ASWB, CSWE, & CSWA Standards for Technology in Social Work Practice*). In addition, Dr. Reamer chaired the international task force sponsored by the Association of Social Work Boards that adopted *Model Regulatory Standards for Technology and Social Work Practice*. He also served on the task force that wrote new technology standards recently added to the NASW Code of Ethics. His recent books include *Risk Management in Social Work; Ethical Standards in Social Work; The Social Work Ethics Casebook; and Boundary Issues and Dual Relationships in the Human Services*, among others.
